

Teacher Notes

Thank you for introducing *Ching Shih* to your class. To extend the book beyond just story time, I have provided a few resources that are age and stage appropriate.

The resources and activities are not exhaustive but ones that I hope will coincide with learning opportunities that may be taking place in class.

Ching Shih, the Girl who ruled the Sea has been written for a target age of 4-7/first level.

LITERACY

Higher Order Thinking Questions for discussion:

Remembering

Name the main characters in the story? Are they good /bad?

Can you remember 3 things that happened to Ching Shih in the story?

Understanding

Describe Ching Shih using 3 adjectives.

How did Ching Shih feel at the beginning / end of the story?

Explain why the story was given the title Ching Shih, The Girl Who Ruled the Sea.

Applying

What have you learned from Ching Shih after reading the story?

How are you like Ching Shih in the story?

Analysing

What was the turning point in the story?

Which part of the story did you like the best? Why did you choose it?

Evaluating

Would you recommend 'Ching Shih, The Girl Who ruled The Sea'? Why or why not?

Why do you think the Ching Shih did what she did in the story?

Creating

How would the story change if you took out a key event in the story?

*The resources also include the chance to write a book review and an adventure of the student's own. (See 'My Adventure' and 'Book Review' resources)

CIRCLE TIME / HEALTH AND WELL-BEING ACTIVITIES

Although the story can be read and enjoyed at any time during the year, you may want to introduce the story at the start of the year when discussing a class code or agreed rules.

Discuss the rules that Ching Shih used with her crew on board her fleet of ships and link with class rules / school rules.

There are also opportunities to discuss the following themes with the class after reading:








Time for some Ching Shih Arrrt!


















Tokens for the 3x3 Treasure Map




Tokens for the 5x5 Treasure Map
